Eligibility Requirements

In order to be a member of the student council, student must:

- Have limited absences and tardies
- No official office discipline referrals
- Score at least a 24/30 on the Teacher Referral (turned in separately by teacher-copy included for reference)
- Available to attend Student Council meetings on Thursdays after school

Student Council Positions

Officers: In order to be elected to one of these offices, qualified candidates must give a short (2-3 minutes) speech stating their intent and explaining their qualifications and plans for how they will uphold the tasks required by their position.

- President- This position is open to 5th or 6th graders. The class president runs council meetings with the assistance of the student council members. The president will also represent the student body in meetings with school administration members.
- Vice President- This position is open to 4th, 5th and 6th graders. The vice president assists president in many duties, including keeping order during meetings. The vice president also stands in for the president when necessary.
- Secretary This position is open to 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. The class secretary is responsible for sending out reminders about meetings and events, as well as keeping accurate record of meetings and student activities. Students interested in becoming secretary should be organized and like to write.
- Treasurer This position is open to 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. The treasurer is responsible for keeping accurate records of funds collected by the council and other school clubs. Students interested in becoming the Treasurer should be organized and be good with numbers.
- Spirit Leader This position is open to 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. The Harelson spirit leader is responsible for creating school spirit days and promoting school spirit around campus. Students interested in this position should be creative, outgoing, and charismatic.
- Community Outreach Liaison- This position is open to 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. The Community Outreach Liaison is responsible for our community outreach including, the Diaper Bank of Southern Arizona, Amphi Foundation, and The Fountains at La Cholla. This person will coordinate activities to help each organization.
- Bobcat News Anchors- This position is open to 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. There are <u>two seats</u> for this position. The Harelson Bobcat News Anchors are responsible for writing and filming the Friday announcements. Students interested in this position should be creative, outgoing, and charismatic.

Step 3: General Campaigning – Hang up your campaign poster:

Please use painter's tape to hang posters. No packing tape.

Each student will be allowed to campaign for the position they desire, as long as they are following the campaigning rules.

General Campaigning Rules:

- 1. All campaigning posters must be **student created.**
- 2. Each student is allowed to make **one** poster.
- 3. These posters need to be placed in appropriate locations and removed by the end of the day on speech day.
- 4. Candidates may not distribute any items (i.e. candy, gum, stickers, etc.) in order to solicit votes from their classmates.
- 5. Candidates may not make unrealistic promises on posters or in their speeches.
- 6. Candidates may not make negative comments about their opponents on any campaign materials.
