Reading & Math

To ensure that all students receive a high quality education from appropriately certified effective staff using research based instructional methods, our school plan includes the following:

- a. 55 minutes of regular reading instruction per day.
- b. 55 minutes of mathematics instruction per day.
- c. 110 minutes of English Language Instruction for English Language Learners daily
- d. Teacher Training in Writing in the Content Area, and Personalized Competency-Based Instruction, and AVID
- e. Instructional Coach to support new teachers
- f. School Improvement Specialist to support teachers with data analysis and to help increase attendance.
