




HOMEWORK


- Monday through Friday

Homework must be turned in daily or it will affect their grade






- Aligned to Common Core and State standards and each lesson is correlated to a specific standard.

- Login information will be coming home in the next week. Bookmark the site.



GRADING POLICIES

- ALL class work and homework may be redone for a better grade if it is a C or below. They just need to write "redone" or "fixed" at the top of the paper and turn it back in. Tests may NOT be redone. If I write "redo" on a paper they MUST fix it and turn it back in.
- 4's are different than 3's. 100% is NOT a 4. Examples: dictation challenge words, verbal/observational assessments in class, higher level activities, open response math tests, initiated projects.
- Grades are determined through a combination of assessment procedures including classroom observations, group participation, completing and turning in assignments, informal and formal grades.
- Graded work will come home throughout the week. Please check your child's backpack and the parent portal.


