Ironwood Ridge High School Mission Statement

The faculty and staff of Ironwood Ridge High School (IRHS) pledge to promote an educational experience that inspires and prepares learners to realize their unique potential. Young adults will be prepared to contribute to society as humane and responsible learners, workers, and citizens who respect diversity and are able to compete successfully in a global society.

School & Community

Ironwood Ridge is located in the Tucson metropolitan area. The school serves the Oro Valley and Catalina communities. IRHS is accredited by Cognia and graduated its first class in 2004. This public high school, operating on a semester system, has a student population of approximately 1,600 students in grades 9 through 12. The mascot is the Nighthawk.

Strategic Goals

Goal 1: Students at IRHS have access to comprehensive, rigorous and relevant academic courses and opportunities to prepare them for success in post-secondary education and for careers in the military and service industries.

Goal 2: Students, staff, parents, and community members feel safe, respected, informed, and invested in maintaining a positive culture and climate at IRHS.

Goal 3: Students and staff will use twenty-first century technology proficiently and responsibly, demonstrate digital citizenship and literacy, and safely use cross-categorical digital skills and resources.

Graduation Requirements

Students must earn a minimum of 22 credits for graduation:

English 4 credits Mathematics 4 credits Science 3 credits 3 credits Social Studies Fine Arts/CTE 1 credit Physical Education 1 credit Electives 6 credits

In 2022, 352 students completed a survey for plans after high school. Of those students, 47% were planning to attend a four-year college, 33% were planning to attend a two-year college, and the remaining 20% reported as other: join the military, work, take a gap year, or enroll in another post-secondary program. The class of 2022 consisted of 389 students with a graduation rate of 94% and was offered nearly \$10 million in scholarships.

- Students may begin earning high school credit in middle school through accelerated programs in mathematics and world language.
- Grade point average (GPA) and class rank are computed beginning with grades from fall semester of freshman year and recalculated each semester thereafter.
- Both weighted and unweighted GPAs are computed and listed on student transcripts; ranking is based on the weighted GPA.

IRHS Scholars Program

Students who meet the following criteria graduate as an IRHS Scholar:

- Overall weighted GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Successful completion of 12 or more Scholars Program classes taken during their high school career.
 - The Scholars Program includes all classes designated as receiving a weighted grade, any dual-enrollment class taken on campus, any core academic class with the word "Advanced" in the title, and any math class accelerated at least one grade level.

Nighthawk athletics has 24 programs that include baseball, basketball, beach volleyball, cross-country, football, golf, pomline, soccer, softball, spirit line, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball, and wrestling.
