Maggie responded, "Yes, I'm okay. But, what was that noise?"


Adalee said, "I think it came from outside. Should we check?"

They entered through the open door and suddenly seemed to have








special powers. Maggie felt like she could fly and she did. She took a spin around the spaceship. She also realized she had laser vision.

"That's funny. I cleaned my room just this morning."


She turned on the light and found a purple glowing rock. She went to Maggie's room and asked what it was.

Adalee and Maggie got mad and threw the rest of the antidote at Dr. Boomer.


Maggie and Adalee had to remake it, but they forgot how, so they guessed.


They put 2 cups of toenail clippings instead of 1 cup of toenail clippings and gave it to Ryder. Ryder turned into a prince!

Maggie and Adalee hugged him and said, "Of course, Ryder. You are welcome!"


All of a sudden there was a "POOF." Ryder was a horse!

"Perfect. He can eat some leaves there," Maggie said. "Let's get some animal food and feed the black panther."


Adalee and Maggie asked together, "What do they eat?"

Maggie said, "Okay, let's go outside and play!"


Their mom told them, "Be careful out there, girls. No getting into trouble."

"We need to get home!" said Maggie.


"But we found Jingles!" said Adalee.

"Thanks, Santa," said Adalee.


"No problem. Ho, Ho, Ho," said Santa.

"And that's my life," said Maggie and Adalee.




A FEW YEARS LATER ...
