The faculty and staff of Ironwood Ridge High School pledge to promote an educational experience that inspires and prepares learners to realize their unique potential. Young adults will be prepared to contribute to society as humane and responsible learners, workers, and citizens who respect diversity and are able to compete successfully in a global society.

School & Community

Ironwood Ridge is located in the Tucson metropolitan area and serves the Oro Valley and Catalina communities. IRHS is accredited by AdvancED and graduated its first class in 2004. This public high school, operating on a semester system, has a student population of approximately 1,800 students in grades 9 through 12.

In 2018, 47% of the graduating class were planning on attending a 4-year college and 43% were planning to attend a 2-year college. The graduation rate is 96%.

Students have the opportunity to earn high school credit and college credit when they enroll in one or more of the following classes:

- Engineering 102
- Biotechnology II
- Writing 101 & 102 at Pima Community College

Students can also earn college credit if they score a 3 or higher on an Advanced Placement Exam.

- Students may begin earning high school credit in middle school through an accelerated program in mathematics and foreign language.
- Grade point average and class rank are computed beginning with the fall of the freshman year and each semester thereafter.
- Both weighted and unweighted GPA's are computed and listed on the transcript.
- Ranking is computed based on the weighted GPA.

Clubs & Organizations

IRHS has over 76 clubs on campus which allow students to grow as leaders and become involved in the community at large. Student clubs and leadership opportunities include National Honor Society, Student Government, Iron Quill Newspaper, Yearbook, Skills USA, Model United Nations, Key Club, Kindness Club, and Performing Arts. IRHS music and theater groups compete annually with distinction.

Athletics

Nighthawk athletics has 23 programs that include baseball, basketball, beach volleyball, cross-country, football, golf, pomline, soccer, softball, spiritline, swimming, tennis, track and field, volleyball, and wrestling. In 2017-2018, IRHS had 213 Individual AIA Scholar Athletes and five AIA Team Scholar Awards. In 2016, IRHS won the AIA Director's Cup.



IRHS Scholars Program

Students who meet the following criteria graduate IRHS as a Scholar:

- Overall weighted GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Successful completion of 12 or more Scholars' Program classes taken during high school career.
- Scholars' Program includes all classes designated as receiving a weighted grade as well as any math class accelerated at least one grade level.
