Introduction: Welcome to Intermediate Algebra at Ironwood Ridge High School. I am thrilled to work with you throughout this upcoming school year. My goal is to promote learning through consistent collaboration and formative feedback.

Class Materials:

- Necessary Intermediate Algebra ISN (Interactive Student Notebook)
- Necessary Access to online resources
- Necessary Folder, pencil(s), eraser
- Necessary Calculator: TI-30XS (or equivalent)
- Recommended An organizational device: binder, notebook, etc.

Homework/Notes: The homework for this course will take the form of assignments in the ISN, Google Classroom and online resources. Therefore, it is **VERY IMPORTANT** that **students have access to the internet**.

Homework will be checked regularly. The dates of assignments can be found in the following areas:

- 2. Homework log posted in the classroom and on Remind *Please reference any, or all, of the aforementioned locations regularly!*

Homework should be complete and neat, with students showing their thought process (work).

Homework will be daily except for test and quiz days. Homework should be completed the day it is assigned and will be reviewed together the next day in class. HW should take <u>no more</u> than 30 minutes.

Assessments:

Assessments will take a variety of forms, including: online exams, projects, oral exams, etc. *I am working to make assessments differentiated and varied to allow for all students to display their comprehension of content in a multitude of ways.* **ISN's may be used with all assessments**.

For traditional exams, I do make test corrections available.

When available, test corrections are available for all students who score less than 90% on any Unit Test. This only applies to Unit Tests; you cannot complete corrections on Final Exams.

To complete test corrections the student must:

- Have completed *ALL assignments* in the Unit.
- Complete the corrections within the given timeframe (usually within a week).
- Show all their work and explain their reasoning.

Weighted Grades: Classwork 30% -- Quizzes/Assessments 30% -- Homework -- 30% Final Exam -- 10%
