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#### CRITERIA FOR SEAL OF EXCELLENCE

<u>Subject area goal</u>: The student will develop individuality and imagination with the resourcefulness to achieve a balance between skill activity, philosophy and aesthetic sensitivity. The student will also experience a process that will encourage responsibility, dedication and a personal commitment to the fine arts. Emphasis will be on the development of the individual's initiative and capacity for self-criticism as well as aesthetic perception and technical competence.

Students must acquire at least 45 points from the following criteria as a prerequisite for a Seal of Excellence:

#### **Instructions for Writing Critiques**

Specific requirements for the five (5) critiques written for Visual Arts, Art History, Photography, Vocal Music, Instrumental Music (Band and Orchestra), or Drama can be found with the content area instructor.

The five (5) critiques should be accumulated during the four years of high school, but each critique must be turned into the instructor within two weeks after the event being critiqued. The instructor shall require student revisions on each critique until all of the communication skills - format, grammar, spelling and critical thinking are exemplified and are indicative of what a student striving for a Seal of Excellence should produce. EACH CRITIQUE MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A PROGRAM OR VERIFICATION OF THE EVENT AND BE ATTACHED TO THE FINAL DRAFT. Critiques should not be a listing of the music played or paintings viewed. A critique is a critical analysis of the content of the program or exhibit. Students should apply appropriate academic vocabulary when critiquing the event.

The final draft of the critique must be type-written and turned in to the Fine Arts Chairperson for final approval. All five (5) final critiques, a completed Seal of Excellence form and a transcript must be submitted to the Department Chairperson NO LATER THAN MAY 1st OF THE SENIOR YEAR for approval in order to be awarded a Seal of Excellence at the convocation and graduation ceremonies.
