


## Typical Junior Year Schedule


- If you have passed all classes and earned enough credits (12),

  - 6. Elective


### How to Choose Next Year Classes

- Parents must also log in to the parent portal and click the box to approve your plan


## Academic Plan



## **Alternates**


#### **Alternates**

#### <u>FAQs</u>

#### How is credit earned?

-> Students receive college credit by earning at least an unweighted 'C' at the end of the semester. Category weights and requirements vary by course.

#### What requirements do these classes satisfy?

-> Each college has different general education requirements so it will vary by school. Each course has a Shared Unique Number (SUN) that identifies it to other schools as an accepted credit. You can follow the QR code to see how these credits transfer to other in-state schools. Be sure to select the correct institution when viewing classes. If you are interested in out-of-state credits, you will need to research the college website to find the information.

#### How do you sign up for a Dual Enrollment class?

-> Some of the classes require placement tests but you will include the class on your course request form when registering for classes. The counseling team and teachers work with the colleges to set up the placement testing.



## **Dual Enrollment Course Information**

If you are signing up for a Dual Enrollment course, you must do two things before the end of the school year:

- Apply to Pima Community College and report your A# to your counselor
- Pass any placement tests required by PCC
  - These will be given in April, and you will be notified in advance if you must test

The following courses are Dual Enrollment through PCC:

- College Algebra (MAT151)
- Culinary II, III, and IV
- English Composition (WRT101 & 102)
- General Chemistry I & II
- Healthcare Foundations
- History of the United States I & II
- Nursing Services
