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
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Message From the Principal: Dr. Oranté Jenkins

ParentSquare is the primary platform for school-home communication in Amphitheater Public Schools.

With ParentSquare families can:

- Receive messages from school via email, text or mobile app.
- Choose to receive information as it comes (Instant) or all at once at around 6 pm (Daily Digest).
- Communicate in your preferred language.
- Send two-way texts with automated translation between staff and families.
- Receive attendance notifications



CREATIVE WRITING CLUB


