4 YEAR COLLEGE PLANNING BY QUARTER

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- You're in high school now! Enjoy it! Attend athletic events, dances, musical and theater performances and make new friends!
- Develop routines to build your academic and time management skills. Freshman grades are vital for college admissions!
 - 1 AUGUST OCTOBER
- Ask your teachers, family, friends and counselor about which classes to select for your Sophomore year.
 Consider AP/Honors classes that are appropriate for you.
- Self-advocate for academic assistance with your teachers.
 Use advisory and tutorial opportunities for success!
- 3 JANUARY-MARCH

- Explore clubs, activities, sports and community service opportunities to meet new people and get involved at school!
- Schedule an appointment with your counselor to create a 4-year plan to best prepare for college admissions.

- Attend College Fairs at CDO and around Tucson to learn about as many college opportunities as possible.

 - Ask your teachers, family, friends and counselor about Junior year classes. Consider AP/IB/Honors classes such as Honors Seminar!
- Earn community services hours on a regular basis for an organization you are proud to represent.
- 3 JANUARY-MARCH

- Push yourself to expand your capabilities. Meet with your counselor to try a new club, sport or activity and to review your 4 year plan.
- Use your problem-solving skills and advocate for academic assistance from your teachers to build up your grit.
- 2 OCTOBER-DECEMBER
- Explore college, community and the CDO Counseling websites for summer camp, internship and/or research opportunities in fields of study that interest you.

4 YEAR COLLEGE PLANNING BY QUARTER

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- Review your Sophomore year, see where and how you want to improve - academically, mentally and socially. Let's goooo!
- While many colleges are testoptional, the PSAT, ACT and SAT are still beneficial for college admissions and scholarship opportunities.
 - 1 AUGUST OCTOBER
- Ask your teachers, families, friends and counselor about Senior year classes such as Honors Capstone.
- Create a list of 6-9 colleges and categorize them as "REACH," "TARGET," or "LIKELY" for acceptance.
- 3 JANUARY-MARCH

- Work with your family and counselor to create a list of potential colleges based on location, affordability, personal fit, majors offered, etc.
- Attend College Fairs and attend college visits at CDO to learn about as many opportunities as possible.
- 2 OCTOBER-DECEMBER
- Schedule a multi-college visit tour (in-person and virtually) for the summer and review their application deadlines.

- Request Letters of Recommendation from teachers, counselors, community members and employers. Find the request form on the CDO Counseling website.
- 4 MARCH-MAY





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- Ask teachers, family, friends, counselors, etc. to review your personal statement, short answer responses and resume.
- Submit your college applications - be aware of Early Decision, Early Action and Regular Decision deadlines.
- **AUGUST OCTOBER**
- Update your resume with your job(s), GPA, community involvement, interests, activities and awards.
- Check your email and college portals daily to stay updated with communication and deadlines.
- JANUARY-MARCH

- Complete the FAFSA application as soon as possible after the October 1st launch. You can list up to 10 colleges that you're considering.
- Apply for scholarships listed on the CDO Counseling website and schedule a counselor appointment to find more!
- **OCTOBER-DECEMBER**
- Review offers of college acceptances and financial aid/scholarship awards with family, teachers and vour counselor.
