Raising Special Kids helped me develop my toolbox.

Jill remembers being in the recovery room the day her son Jon was born. When her husband returned to her side after checking on the baby, she described him as “changed.” The doctor explained to her what he had already shared with her husband; he had identified a few markers for Down syndrome. Jill’s limited understanding and experience provided her with a not-so-optimistic vision for her son’s future.

It did not take her long to adjust to what she refers to as “the new normal” which included weekly visits from an early interventionist and various therapists. When Jon

was in first grade, Jill reached out to Raising Special Kids for help with school. She recalls, “One of the most important things I’ve learned from Raising Special Kids is that parents are valuable members of any team decision-making process and their participation is required by law. Parents are powerful when given the right tools and Raising Special Kids helped me develop my toolbox. I regularly refer parents to Raising Special Kids and I tell them how much the organization helped me. And, most importantly, Raising Special Kids never turns anyone away.”

Raising Special Kids exists to improve the lives of children with disabilities, from birth to 26, by providing families with training, information, and individual assistance to help parents become effective advocates.

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

Under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)

Parent Training and Information Centers (PTIs) are established under the IDEA to assist parents in understanding their rights in special education. As the PTI for Arizona, Raising Special Kids serves families statewide to assist their children and young adults from birth to age 26 with all types of disability, including: physical, intellectual, behavioral, emotional, and learning disabilities.



Becoming an Advocate for Your Child

Having a child with a rare, undiagnosed genetic condition is a challenging journey. We faced so many unknowns with medical issues and developmental stages. It was very hard to find resources and help.

My first contact with Raising Special Kids was five years ago, when I had some difficulty with Taryn's preschool services. I called to explain about my daughter's situation and requested assistance. Raising Special Kids helped me understand Taryn's educational services and offered great suggestions on how to work with the school to resolve problems and issues.

Nuestra Misión

- Conexión con un mentor de padres cualificado, y dotado para proveer información y apoyo.
- Talleres y capacitación para aumentar destrezas para abogar y mejorar la habilidad de trabajar con profesionales.
- Derivación a agencias, organizaciones y recursos comunitarios con la pericia para cubrir las necesidades de su familia.




