



## Spending by operational area








## Changes in operational spending percentages




## Total operational and instructional spending per pupil (inflation adjusted to 2016 dollars)


## Country of Birth for ELL Students – 2016-17



## Reclassified Rate of ELL Students, by School of Enrollment – 2016-17






# Teacher Turnover Rate & Reason Given for Leaving


## Average Daily Attendance – 1<sup>st</sup> through 100<sup>th</sup> Day




# MAP Fall to Spring Growth: Elementary School






Average Number of RIT Points Above Expected Growth




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# Graduation Rate: By School and Special Program Membership





In March 2016, the College Board redesigned the SAT test, removing the Critical Reading and Writing subject areas and adding the new Evidence-Based Reading and Writing subject area. Therefore, the overall possible score of the SAT test decreased from 2400 points to 1600 points and scores given for SAT tests administered before March 2016 are not comparable to the scores given for the redesigned SAT.





## Advanced Placement Testing: 5-year Trends








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# Mobility Rate







